On this 24<sup>th</sup> day of April  
 A D 1855 personally appeared before me  
 a Justice of the Peace within and for the  
 County and State aforesaid Gideon Lang-  
 don aged 60 years a resident of  
 Marquette County State of Wisconsin who  
 being duly sworn according to law de-  
 clares that he is the identical man who  
 was a private in the company com-  
 manded by Captain James Hall in the  
 regiment of militia commanded by W<sup>c</sup>  
 Mann in the war with Great Britain declar-  
 ed by the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of June  
 1812 that he entered the service from Chautau-  
 que County A D 1813 and continued in ac-  
 tual service in said war for the term of  
 fourteen days and was in the battle at  
 Black-sack and was honorably discharged  
 at the same place on the day of said ad-  
 dition

He makes this declaration for the  
 purpose of obtaining the bounty land to  
 which he may be entitled under the act  
 approved March 3. 1855. He also de-  
 clares that he has not received a warrant  
 for bounty land under this or any other  
 act of Congress nor made any other applica-  
 tion therefor

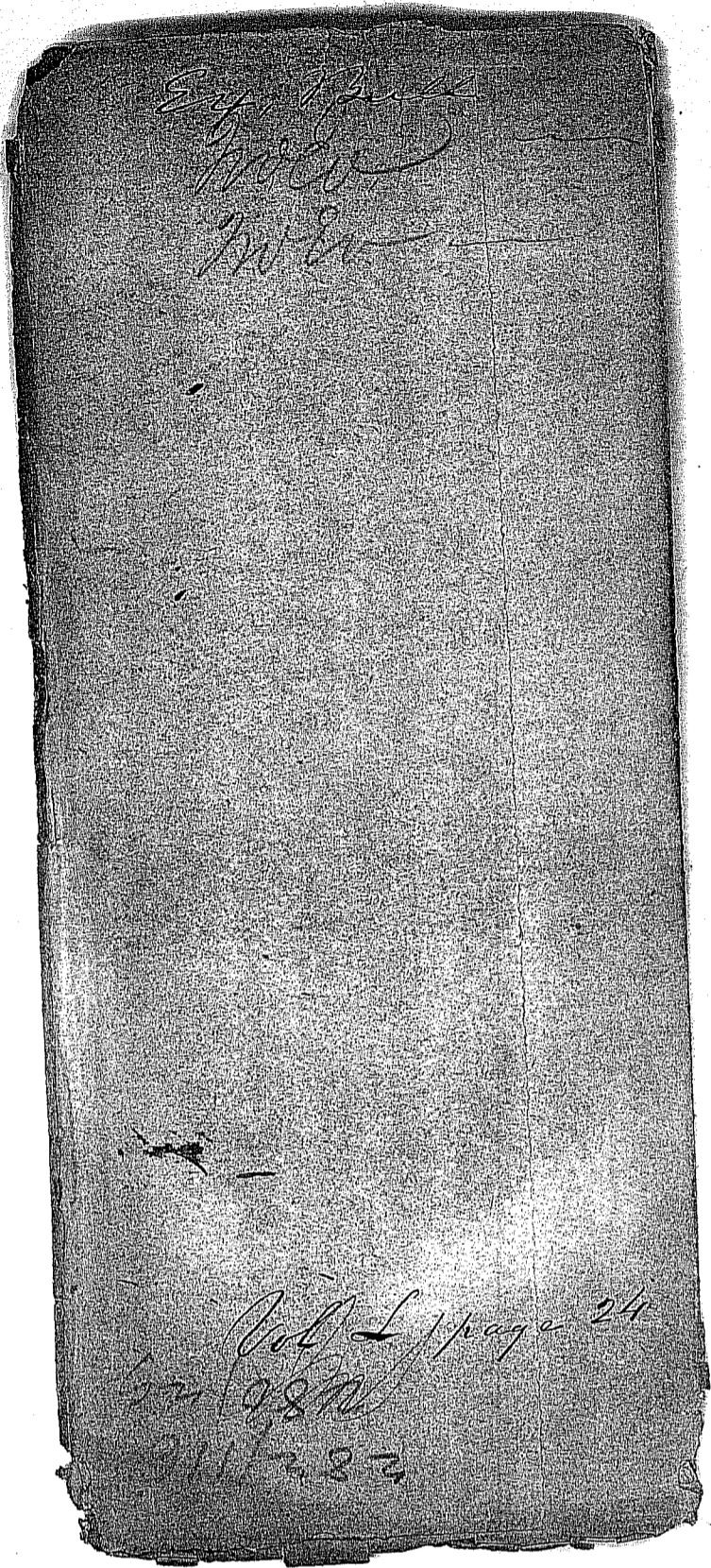
