





On this 24th day of April
A D 1855 personally appeared before me
a Justice of the Peace within and for the
County and State aforesaid Gideon Lan-
gdon aged 60 years a resident of
Marquette County State of Wisconsin who
being duly sworn according to law de-
clares that he is the identical man who
was a private in the company com-
manded by Captain James Hale in the
regiment of militia commanded by Wm C.
Men in the war with Great Britain decla-
red by the United States on the 18th day of June
1812 that he entered the service from Chantau-
gne county A D 1813 and continued in ac-
tual service in said war for the term of
fourteen days and was in the battle at
Blackrock and was honorably discharged
at the same place on the day of said bat-
tle

He makes this declaration for the
purpose of obtaining the bounty land to
which he may be entitled under the act
approved March 3. 1855. He also de-
clares that he has not received a warrant
for bounty land under this or any other
act of Congress nor made any other applica-
tion therefor
